On behalf of our governors, staff team and children, I would like to extend a very warm welcome to all families new to our Nursery School. We are delighted that you have chosen Hungerford Nursery School for your child. It is so important to us that you and your child feel settled and part of our community as quickly as possible; we will do all we can to make that happen.

The Nursery School has been here since 1942 and in our current building for 20 years. As a Maintained Nursery School (MNS), we are funded and controlled by the Local Authority (LA) just like all other LA schools. We are led by a headteacher and employ qualified teachers as part of our staff. Successive Governments have called MNS 'the jewel in the crown' of early years education because of the levels of expertise of staff and the outstanding progress that children who attend MNS make to age 5 and beyond.

At Hungerford Nursery School, our children learn through play, sharing stimulating, first-hand experiences in a caring and happy environment. Our outdoor spaces are a particular feature of the education provision here, because we feel that it is crucial for children to have lots of high-quality learning experiences outdoors. As a staff body, we aim to work in partnership with you, our local community and other professionals to support your child's learning and development and to prepare them for their next steps in their learning journey.

This handbook has some key information about how our Nursery School works organised in alphabetical order to make it easy for you to navigate and hopefully answer any questions you may have. If you cannot find the answers to any question you may have, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff or contact the office.

We look forward to sharing your child's learning journey with you during their time with us.

## An ABC of what you need to know to get you started

<p><b>Absences</b></p>	<p>It is our responsibility to ensure that all children who attend Hungerford Nursery School are safe. For this reason we ask you to always contact us if your child is not able to come to nursery to inform us of their absence and the reason, either by telephone 01488 682628 option 1 or by emailing the school office on <a href="mailto:office@hungerfordnursery.w-berks.sch.uk">office@hungerfordnursery.w-berks.sch.uk</a></p> <p>It is helpful if you can do this before the start of the school day so that their teacher is aware in advance.</p>
<p><b>Additional Hours</b></p>	<p>If you wish to increase the hours that your child attends nursery, please speak to Sara in the office and she will be able to tell you if we have the space. We operate a waiting list system for sessions if we are unable to accommodate your request. Additional hours are subject to charges. Please see the 'Charges' section for information on prices.</p>
<p><b>Allergies</b></p>	<p>We do have children and staff who suffer from serious allergies. If your child suffers from diagnosed allergies, please ensure that staff always have the information necessary to keep your child safe.</p> <p>Hungerford Nursery School is a <b>nut-free school</b> so children should not bring in any products which contain nuts such as cereal bars, peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches in lunchboxes.</p>
<p><b>Animals</b></p>	<p>For health and safety reasons, dogs/animals are not permitted on the nursery school grounds (within the perimeter fence). Exceptions include therapy dogs and guide dogs.</p> <p>We occasionally have special visits involving animals arranged for learning opportunities, but these are planned and have been risk assessed.</p>
<p><b>Assessing your child's learning</b></p>	<p>Assessment plays an important part in helping us to recognise your child's progress, understand their needs, plan appropriate activities and support them where necessary.</p> <p>Ongoing assessment is an integral part of the learning and development process. We use OP&amp;L (Observation of Play &amp; Learning) as our approach to assessing children's learning and progress. We observe your child in play situations to ascertain their current level of achievement, interests and learning styles and then use these observations to shape their learning experiences.</p> <p>More information about OP&amp;L can be found in the Parent Guide <b>Appendix 1</b>.</p> <p>We use an online platform called 'Learning Journals' to record observations, photos and important events in Nursery School. Your child's Learning Journal is shared with you and you can add your own photos and videos of things your child does and achieves at home.</p>

<p><b>Attendance and lateness</b></p>	<p>Whilst attendance for children below compulsory school age is not legally mandated, it is strongly encouraged due to the significant benefits that it offers for early learning and development. Regular and prompt attendance helps children establish routines, build social skills and make a smoother transition to primary school. We do monitor attendance and will contact you to come in and discuss attendance if it becomes a concern.</p> <p>The school day starts at 9am and we kindly ask parents and carers to try their best to ensure that children arrive promptly and ready for the 9am start. Staff will stay on the doors until 9:05am. If you arrive after the doors have closed, you must walk your child to the main entrance and sign your child in with office staff. Arriving late can be disruptive for your child and the other children in class, so please avoid doing so wherever possible.</p>
<p><b>Bags</b></p>	<p>All children are provided with a red book bag when they start with us. This is for borrowing books each week to bring home and share with you.</p> <p>Children are also provided with a cloth bag each which is for you to fill with spare clothes. These bags will stay in nursery on their pegs, and we ask that you regularly replenish these bags with appropriate clothing.</p>
<p><b>Birthdays</b></p>	<p>We know that children’s birthdays are important milestones and will therefore be celebrated in nursery school by singing ‘Happy Birthday’. If you would like to, you can provide fruit or stickers for your child to share with all children in class to mark the day. To support healthy eating, please do not bring in sweets or biscuits.</p>
<p><b>Charges</b></p>	<p>Charges are reviewed annually by the Governing Board</p> <p>Summary of fees from September 2025:  Hourly Rate - £7.50  Breakfast Club 8am – 9am inc. food - £8.00  After School Club 3.30 – 5.30 inc. snack - £16.00  Snack and Cooking Ingredients per term - £25.00</p> <p>Fees are payable half termly in advance. Invoices will be sent out via our School Money app.</p>
<p><b>Clothing</b></p>	<p>Please <b>name all clothing including shoes and coats</b> as there are often duplicates and clear name labels helps staff enormously! A named coat is essential so that we can be outside whatever the weather.</p> <p>Children love to climb, paint and play with water at nursery school – they will get dirty and wet so please ensure that they wear clothes that enable them to fully explore and learn from their surroundings.</p> <p>To encourage independence, it is helpful if children come to nursery in clothes which are easy to remove and put on e.g. Leggings or jogging bottoms with minimal</p>

	fastenings, shoes with Velcro or zip fastenings (no laces, backless shoes, flip flops or Crocs).
<b>Comforters</b>	<p>If your child has a special toy or blanket which they require for sleeping at nursery, please ensure that it comes to nursery in a bag which will stay on their peg until it is required.</p> <p>Please note that <b>we do not allow children to use dummies whilst in nursery</b> and we encourage you to not allow your children to bring them in or arrive at nursery using a dummy.</p>
<b>Communication</b>	<p>To minimise the amount of paper that we use, we send as much information as we can via our SchoolPing app. If you have any queries regarding this app, please speak to Sara Fenton in the office.</p> <p>Newsletters are sent at the end of every half term. Please take time to read these as they include lots of information about important events and dates for your diary as well as what the children have been getting up to across the nursery school.</p> <p>Invoices for fees are paid via the SchoolMoney app. You will receive login details within 7 days of your child's start date.</p>
<b>Drinks</b>	<p>We ask all children to bring in a <b>named</b> water bottle each day for them to drink with lunch. Please can we ask that only water is sent in to drink and <b>no squash or fizzy drinks</b>.</p> <p>For snack times, children will be offered water or milk to drink from an open cup.</p>
<b>Drop Off and Collection</b>	<p><b>Turtle and Starfish Class</b> All drop off and collection will happen from the main nursery school doors. Staff will meet your child at the door, and you will collect them from the same doors.</p> <p><b>Jellyfish Class</b> Drop off and collection (at 3:30pm) will be from the hall door.</p> <p><b>Dolphin Class</b> Drop off and collection will be from Dolphin classroom door. Please queue alongside the nursery school building from the carpark, drop off/collect and then exit the side gate into the Croft Field Centre carpark to ensure a smooth flow of traffic.</p> <p><b>Jellyfish and Dolphin Class collection at 12pm and 2pm</b> Will be from Dolphin classroom – see details above.</p>

<p><b>English as an Additional Language</b></p>	<p>Our staff have a great deal of experience with teaching children who do not speak English as their home language. Children react in different ways, some developing good fluency within a short period of time with others preferring to sit and listen before speaking themselves. A fully proficient level of fluency may take up to 3 years, whilst it takes up to 7 years for a child to be fully bilingual.</p> <p><b>The most important thing you can do is to continue to speak in your home language (your most fluent language) with your child so that they can also learn to speak it fluently.</b></p> <p>Knowledge of one language makes learning a second language much easier. If each parent has a different home language, it's fine for you to both speak your own language to your child.</p>
<p><b>First Aid</b></p>	<p>Young children have lots of trips and falls because they are growing and this affects their balance (vestibular system) and their body mapping (proprioceptive system). All minor incidents are dealt with by staff. Injuries such as cuts and bumps will be recorded on our app 'Learning Journals'. In the unlikely event of a more serious injury, or a head injury, you will be contacted by telephone so that you are aware of the situation as soon as possible.</p> <p>Staff in each classroom are trained first aiders having undertaken the Paediatric First Aid Course which include CPR.</p>
<p><b>Food at Nursery School</b></p>	<p>Parents and carers are asked to provide a balanced packed lunch for children who stay for lunch. Healthy lunch ideas are provided in the newsletters. Please do not send chocolates, sweets or drinks other than water.</p> <p>There is no need to send your child to Nursery School with snacks as during the morning, our snack tables are open in each classroom where we provide a snack of fruits, vegetables and other healthy snacks such as crackers, breadsticks etc with a drink of either milk or water.</p> <p>If your child attends Breakfast Club, they will be provided with a choice of cereals and wholemeal toast with butter or marmite.</p> <p>If your child attends After School Club, they will be provided with a snack between 4pm and 4:30pm.</p> <p>At Nursery School, we serve drinks in open cups and children are expected to sit at the table whilst they eat and drink. Adults sit with the children on tables of no more than 8 children to supervise them whilst they eat and drink.</p>
<p><b>Governing Body</b></p>	<p>As a state-maintained school, we have a board of governors who are collectively responsible for the overall direction of the school and its strategic management. The full governing board meets 6 times a year with some additional finance meetings for selected governors.</p> <p>See <b>Appendix 3</b> for more information about being a governor at our Nursery School.</p>

<p><b>Health and Safety</b></p>	<p>The safety of your children is always our priority. We request that all members of our community are vigilant and report any concerns to a member of staff immediately. If you are visiting the school, please abide by any Health and Safety requests made by staff and take time to familiarise yourself with the fire escape routes of the area in which you are based.</p> <p>Regular fire drills happen, and your child will be regularly educated in fire safety.</p>
<p><b>Healthy Living</b></p>	<p>We know that all parents want their children to grow up to be healthy and strong and we try to support families with this aim.</p> <p>Government advice is that children under 5 should have at least 3 hours of physical activity every day. For this reason, at Nursery School, we minimise the time spent sitting down and encourage all our children to spend time outdoors, whatever the weather. Having lots of opportunities for functional movement through play helps children develop the large muscle groups they need to be ready for school.</p>
<p><b>How we Learn at Nursery School</b></p>	<p><b>Wellbeing, involvement and Creating Effective Learners</b>  Children of all ages need to have high levels of wellbeing before they can start learning. It is something that we monitor very carefully and is the reason we take transition from home to Nursery School so seriously. Some children settle very quickly whilst others need more support. We respond to their individual needs so that they have a positive first experience of being separated from their main carers.</p> <p>For children to challenge themselves they need to have high levels of involvement in what they are doing. Our experienced staff observe children very carefully and know exactly when to step in to extend children’s learning or support them to challenge themselves. Our focus is particularly on supporting children to develop the ‘Characteristics of Effective Learning’. These are the ways in which children engage with other people and their environment through ‘Playing and Learning’, ‘Active Learning’ and ‘Creating and Thinking Critically’. These underpin learning and development across all areas and support the children to become effective and motivated learners.</p> <p><b>The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum</b>  The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is followed by all Early Years settings in England to the end of Reception year in primary school. The curriculum emphasises the importance of play as the most effective way to learn.</p> <p>The curriculum is split up into 7 areas of learning:  <b>Prime Areas</b>  Communication and Language  Physical Development  Personal, Social and Emotional Development  <b>Specific Areas</b>  Literacy  Mathematics  Understanding the World  Expressive Arts and Design</p>

	<p>At Nursery School we focus on the Prime Areas of learning, which form important foundations to all future learning and development.</p>
<p><b>Involving Families in Nursery School Life</b></p>	<p>Our aim is to work in partnership with parents and carers; we are mindful that you are your child's first, and most important educators.</p> <p>We always welcome the involvement of families who can support us with reading stories, sharing skills or family traditions and celebrations from your own heritage such as Chinese New Year, Diwali etc.</p> <p>SHOAL is our fundraising organisation and is a charity separate from the Nursery School. Parents are encouraged to volunteer as members of SHOAL or to help organise events. Please speak to the office if you would like to get involved.</p> <p>The Nursery School governing body has 2 places for parent governors. Please see the 'Governing Body' section for more information.</p>
<p><b>Key Person</b></p>	<p>Our teachers oversee each class and children however we also run a Key Person system. When they start at Nursery School, your child will be allocated a Key Person who will be responsible for maintaining records of your child's learning and progress with the support of the class teachers.</p> <p>Children are allocated a 'Key Person' within the first few weeks of term and you will be informed of who your child's key person is. During the school year, you will have two opportunities to meet with your child's Key Person to discuss their progress and next steps at the end of their 'Spotlight' months. For more information about the assessment process, please see the Parent Guide <b>Appendix 1</b></p>
<p><b>Medical, including Medicines and Illness</b></p>	<p>Please inform us of any diagnosed medical needs by completing the 'Medical Form'.</p> <p>We are happy to administer prescribed medication and ask that you complete a permission form to give us the correct instructions. Medication should be delivered to the office where you will also get the permission form from.</p> <p>We are not able to administer over the counter medication such as Calpol. If you think that your child needs a dose of this type of medication, then they are not well enough to be at Nursery School. We do keep a bottle of Calpol, Piriton and a blue inhaler onsite for emergencies when parents cannot collect their child quickly. We would always seek verbal permission from parents and carers before giving this medication and require you to sign a form on arrival to say that you gave permission.</p> <p>For more serious medical conditions, we will complete an 'Action Plan' which will be shared and displayed in nursery to follow in an emergency.</p> <p>Staff at Nursery School are trained to support children with asthma or similar respiratory conditions. If your child has been prescribed an inhaler, we will require an inhaler and spacer that can be kept in school to avoid you needing to transport it to and from Nursery School.</p> <p>Staff are trained to administer adrenaline pens. If your child has an allergy that requires the use of an adrenaline pen then we will require an adrenaline pen to stay in Nursery School.</p>

	<p><b>Whilst we are as vigilant as possible, it is your responsibility to ensure that medications kept in Nursery School are in date and still required.</b></p> <p>If your child has been sick or has had diarrhoea they must be kept off Nursery School for <b>48 hours</b> after the last episode to minimise the spread of infection to other children and staff. If your child feels ill during the day, we will contact you and possibly advise you to collect your child so it is important that you keep your contact information up to date.</p> <p>For information about accidents and first aid at Nursery School, please see the 'First Aid' section.</p>
<p><b>Mobile Phones</b></p>	<p>Nursery is a mobile free zone, and we ask parents and carers to refrain from using mobiles phones whilst on Nursery School Premises.</p>
<p><b>Nappies and Toilet Training</b></p>	<p>We have the facilities in Nursery School for nappy changing and we require you to supply your own nappies and wipes which we will name and store in nursery.</p> <p><b>Please ensure that your child starts their Nursery School session in a dry, clean nappy. We also ask that you please use nappies rather than pull ups as it is much quicker for us to change a nappy (a big consideration when there are several to change!).</b></p> <p>Our classroom staff are happy to offer advice about how you can help your child to use the toilet and will work together with you to support your child to make this transition. Unless your child has an additional need or disability, we would expect them to be using the toilet during the day by around the time of their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday. We can call on the support of Health Visitors if we feel that additional help and support is needed.</p>
<p><b>Nursery School Day</b></p>	<p>Our Nursery School Day starts at 9am for all children.</p> <p>Session times are either 9am – 12pm, 9am – 2pm or 9am – 3:30pm. For details of our before and after school care, please see the 'Wraparound Care' section.</p> <p>Please make every effort to collect your child punctually at the end of their session and avoid collecting them early as this is disruptive for the class and can unsettle the other children.</p> <p><b>15 Hours</b> For children eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare we ask you to select either every morning 9am – 12pm or 3 days 9am – 2pm.</p> <p><b>30 Hours</b> Our 30-hour offer is Monday – Thursday 9am – 3:30pm and Friday 9am – 1pm.</p> <p>For information on purchasing additional hours please see the 'Additional Hours' section.</p>

<p><b>Offsite activities</b></p>	<p>We like to take the children out of Nursery School and into the community whenever we can. Examples of visits are to the Library, the Market, Hungerford Resource Centre and Boxford Woods. Rather than obtaining permission each time, we ask you to complete a permission form once a year giving us permission to take your children out when the occasion arises.</p> <p>If a trip involves going on our Nursery School minibus, we will always communicate this to you prior to the day.</p>
<p><b>Organisation of Children</b></p>	<p>Our Nursery School is organised into 4 classes.</p> <p><b>Turtles and Starfish Classes</b> – 2-3yr olds  <b>Jellyfish and Dolphin Classes</b> – 3-4yr olds</p>
<p><b>Parking</b></p>	<p>The Croft becomes extremely congested at drop off and pick up times. Whenever possible please do try and encourage your children to walk to Nursery, even if just from outside The Croft. We know not everyone is able to walk, so if you need to bring the car into The Croft, please be kind enough to park considerately, do not block neighbours' drives or park illegally.</p> <p>Please do not park in the Nursery School car park which is reserved for staff cars.</p>
<p><b>Policies</b></p>	<p>Please refer to our school website and familiarise yourself with our key Nursery School policy documents.</p>
<p><b>Safeguarding</b></p>	<p>Links to important safeguarding information can be found on our school website.</p> <p>The designated lead officer (DSL) for safeguarding is the Headteacher; two other members of staff is also trained at this level (Deputy DSL).</p> <p>All staff have received the Universal Child Protection level training. Children are made aware of the people they can talk to if they are worried about anything and this is regularly reinforced.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Settling In</b></p>	<p>For most children, coming to Nursery School is the first time they will have left their main carers. This may well cause some upset that you need to be prepared for. We support you by having a carefully planned transition from home to Nursery School.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We will visit you and your child at home. At home, children tend to be more relaxed and enjoy showing us their toys and favourite books. We also use this time to talk with you about your child.</li> <li>• We have a ‘Parent Information Evening’ in Nursery School for you to meet some of the staff and hear about our Nursery School and what you can expect from us.</li> <li>• We have a ‘Stay and Play’ session when we encourage you and your child to explore the classroom that they will be joining for them and you to become familiar with their surroundings.</li> <li>• When children stay at Nursery School on their own for the first time, they can get very upset that their parent/carer has left them. Part of solving this separation anxiety is for them to learn that you will always come and collect them. Therefore, at first, we suggest you only leave your child for a short period of time.</li> <li>• Children take different amounts of time to adjust to being left – our staff are really experienced at handling separation anxiety, and we advise you to be guided by their suggestions.</li> </ul> <p>We know that separation can be tricky for parents as well as for children and we will do our best to support you and find what is right for you and your family.</p> <p><b>Please note that if you have a holiday booked in the first few weeks of your child’s settling in, we may suggest that you delay their entry to Nursery School until you return.</b></p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Smoking</b></p>	<p>Our Nursery School is a non-smoking site; visitors are requested not to smoke (including e-cigarettes and vapes) anywhere on the grounds nor anywhere where any pupils can see them. You will be asked to stop smoking or vaping if seen by a member of staff.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Special Educational Needs</b></p>	<p>We are an inclusive Nursery School that welcomes children of all needs and abilities. We have a qualified SENCo (Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator) and very experienced support staff who work with children who have additional educational and physical needs. Our SENCo supports the staff and offering advice on how best to support children with additional needs.</p> <p>If you already know that your child has additional needs and they have seen a professional such as a medical specialist, paediatrician or speech &amp; language therapist, please let staff know as soon as possible so that we are in the best place to support your child and you.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Term Dates</b></p>	<p>Term dates and Inset days are published on our website and can also be found in this pack. See <b>Appendix 4</b>.</p>

<p><b>Wraparound Care</b></p>	<p>We run a Breakfast Club each morning from 8am and an After School Club from 3:30pm – 5:30pm Monday – Thursday.</p> <p>These are run by Nursery School Staff and are chargeable – funded hours cannot be used to pay for these sessions.</p> <p><b>Breakfast Club</b> Breakfast Club runs from our Nursery School Hall. Children are welcomed at the hall door and remain in the hall until they are taken into their classrooms for 9am.</p> <p><b>After School Club</b> After School Club runs from Turtles Classroom and garden at the front of the Nursery School. Children must be collected by 5:30pm, but can also be collected earlier.</p> <p>For details about food served at Breakfast and After School Club, please see the 'Food at Nursery School' section.</p> <p>Spaces for Breakfast Club and After School Club are limited to ensure that we are within ratio. We operate a waiting list for spaces which you can join if we are unable to offer you what you require.</p>
